Message from Head Priest

Namasthe, Hari Om

It gives me a great pleasure to meet with you all through Sandesh article. Wishing you all Happy Ugadi, Gudipadva, Naya Samvat, Baishakhi and Tamil New Year's Day, Shri Ram Navami, Hanuman Jayanthi, and Mahaveer Swami Jayanthi. According to our Hindu calendar the second quarter of the year is with many grand festivals. I request you all to participate in Shri Ram Navami celebrations Akhand Ramayan Path. The temple created HSNEF Akhand Ramayan WhatsApp group. Please join the WhatsApp group, participate in the Akhand Ramayan Path, and be blessed by Shri Ram Ji and Hanuman Ji.

In this article I would like to focus on Hindu Panchang (Hindu Almanac). In our tradition, on Hindu new year day, as part of celebration, we publish the Hindu Panchang (Hindu Calendar), which is very important from the religious perspective.

What is Panchang? Five limbs of the day are known as Panchang. In simple terms, "Panchānga" means the Day, Nakshatra (Star), tithi, Yoga and Karana of every day. It is a mirror of the sky. It is known as panchang because it is five folded. This panchang is very important to know the religious observations, festivals, eclipses and other almanac details. Panchang is referred to know name of the Hindu month, Star, Moon Rasi, Muhurata and Choghadia. It is also used to determine the auspicious time (muhurtha) for the events and Pujas that we celebrate. The basic purpose of Hindu Panchāngam is to check various Hindu festivals and auspicious time (election-Muhurta).

On Ugadi and Naya Samvat Day (Hindu New Year) Panchanga, Alamanac Book is will be published in every Hindu Temple. Every one of us eager to know the panchang prediction of our yearly income and expenses. This will help us to organize and plan the year.

The Hindu New year from April 9th, 2024, to March 30th, 2025, is known as Krodhi or Kalayukthi Nama Samvatsar. Angarak (Mars) is the king of this year and Surya (Sun) the minister. The results and predictions are computed according to the placement of the planets on the date of Hindu new Year. Let us focus on Income (Adaaya) Expense (Vyaya) of twenty-seven stars and twelve zodiac signs (Rashis) given under in the table form.

On April 8th partial Solar eclipse is occurring in Jacksonville Florida. On April 8th morning the temple remains closed because of Solar eclipse. The temple services will be revived for evening services after shuddhi, offering special prayers for Solar eclipse. During eclipse time Gayatri and Maha Mritunjaya Jaap is very powerful, and the result of the mantra is multiplied one hundred times. During Solar eclipse, lid the lamp at the shrines at you home and observe some meditation, which will take away the Grahan Dosha (negative vibration of eclipse).

Perspectives on Sri Rama Navami.

In the month of April, Sri Rama Navami is celebrated all over the world and by followers of Sanatana Dharma. The festival celebrates the birth of Lord Rama who is 7th incarnation of Lord Vishnu. The vent is celebrated on the 9th day of First month of Hindu Calendar.

He is said to be descended from the Sun God in the solar dynasty. During the birthday celebration people adore, admire, revere, rejoice, reflect on the life of Lord Rama who beame king of Ayodhya. He was known for his exemplary qualities. He was brave, popular, Kind, intelligent, loving, and obedient and dutiful.



Instead of dwelling on the life history of Sri rama, it will be worthwhile to learn how did the ithihasa of Sri Rama came into existence. For this one must read it in Valmiki Ramayana, Balakanda Sarga, verses 1.1.1 to verse 1.1.18.

There was once an occasion when the great celestial Sage Narada met up with sage Valmiki at the hermitage at Bithoor, Uttar Pradesh, India.

There Valmiki asked Sage Narada who among the heroes of this world is the highest in virtue and wisdom. Valmiki Listed 16 qualities.

को न्वस्मिन् साम्प्रतं लोके गुणवान् कश्च वीर्यवान् ।

धर्मज्ञश्च कृतज्ञश्च सत्यवाक्यो दृढव्रतः ॥ १-१-२

*kaḥ nu asmin sāmpratam loke guṇavān kaḥ ca vīryavān /
dharmajñāḥ ca kṛtajñāḥ ca satya vākya dhrḍha vrataḥ ॥ 1-1-2*

The listed 16 qualities listed by Valmiki were 1. good characteristics, 2. valor, 3. astute follower of the prescribed rituals, 4. righteousness, 5. benevolence and gratitude, 6. not uttering lies, 7. ever speaking the truth, 8. steadfastness in fulfilling the resolves taken, 9. self-realization, 10. conqueror of anger, and being without 11. passion, 12. jealousy, 13. calumny, 14. having wisdom and intelligence, 15. statesmanship with moral conduct and 16. fortunes.

Sage Narada unhesitatingly replied in the next few verses, that it is Sri Rama who possessed all these qualities. Sage Narada had blessed the poet with about 100 slokas titled “Sankshepa Ramayanam”. The poet later developed and expanded it to 24,000 slokas.

Now, sage Narada replies you have asked me sixteen questions. But for all the sixteen put together, I have only one answer for you! “he says.

“Ikshvaaku vamsaprabhavaha raamo naama janaishruthaha!”

The answer is very simple! That person who is embodiment of all the sixteen noble qualities is none other than the king who is born in the "ikshvaaku" dynasty, Lord Rama- son of the great king Dasaratha!. He is born in the clan of the Surya (The sun God) and born to the ancestral tradition of the great king Manu and Kaakutsa. Then Narada proceeds to tell Valmiki the entire story of Ramayana. Valmiki later developed the whole Ramayana into 24,000 slokas and thus was born the Complete Ramayanam.

Thus is the importance and the noble qualities of Lord Rama which makes his birthday celebrations such a great event.

Lord Rama is always worshiped with his consort Sita, brother Lakshmana and devotee Hanuman.



Incidentally in South India, especially in Tamil nadu, young couples after their wedding seek blessings from elders and the elders bless them in Tamil பதினாறும் பெற்று பெருவாழ்வு வாழ்க pathinarum petru vazhvu vazhga, which translates to "lead a great life by acquiring sixteen kinds of wealth. Often people misunderstand this and conclude the meaning as 'give birth to sixteen children and lead a prosperous life. Elders are blessing the couples that they attain the sixteen qualities of Lord Rama.

श्री राम राम रामेति रमे रामे मनोरमे ।
सहस्रनाम तत्तुल्यं रामनाम वरानने ॥

**Shri Rama Rama Rameti, Rame Rame Manorame;
Sahasrenama tattulyam, Rama Nama Varanane**

Meaning:

- 1: By meditating on "Rama Rama Rama" (the Name of Rama), my Mind gets absorbed in the Divine Consciousness of Rama, which is Transcendental,
- 2: The Name of Rama is as Great as the Thousand Names of God (Vishnu Sahasranama-stotra)

Ram temple at Ayodhya:

A 200-year journey, with many milestones

As we celebrate Sri Rama Navami in April, and with the recent Consecration and prana pratishtha of Sri Rama at the Ayodhya temple it is worth looking into the events which gave the right to the Ram Temple in Ayodhya.

The controversy about the existence of Ram mandir under the Bajri Mosque goes back for several decades. Hindus and Muslims fought vigorously for the claim. Court cases go as far back as 1822. Several conflicts on this controversy have claimed the life of several on both sides.

Archeological society of India (ASI) and the supreme court have asked for several clarifications. The report submitted to the court by the ASI found that sculptural remains indicate existence of large Hindu temple. The report mentions stones with inscription on it which were recorded in the construction of the mosque during the reign of Mughal Emperor Aurangzeb between the year 1676-1677. The pre-existing structure was destroyed after Aurangzeb issued orders to demolish according to Maasir-Alamgiri (1947) by sir Jadunath Sarkar (page 55)

During the ASI survey, it found inscriptions on stones were in Devanagari, Grantha, Telegu and Kannada Scripts with names of deities. The survey also indicated that the pillars and plasters in the corridor indicated that they were part of pre-existing temple. Sculptural remains in cellars indicate that there existed a large Hindu Temple. Sculptures of Hindu Deities and carved architectural members were found under the dumped soil. In one of the pillars Pillar #100 had an idol of Lord Ganesh.

In 2019 the Supreme court of India reviewed all these findings.

Corroborating report from Sant Semaj indicated such a mention of Hindu temple is recorded in Skanda Puranam. This is an ancient document that maps all the important places of Hindu Pilgrimage. It has geological locations of all Hindu Teertha Sthalams. The exact location of the birthplace of Bhagwan Ram is mentioned in the Vaishna Khand/ Ayodhya Mahatamya.

The testimony of Avimukteshwarananda changed the case and the Muslim side knew that they have lost the case. The only way to save their case was to prove the Shankaracharya's testimony as wrong. The Muslim side asks for permission to cross examine the Shankaracharya.

15 lawyers from the Muslim side do the cross examination of Avimukteswarananda for the next 10 days. The Shankaracharya gives brilliant replies to all their questions while all the 5 judges kept listening to him.

In 2010, a special bench of the Allahabad High Court under Justices SU Khan, Sudhir Agarwal and Dharam Veer Sharma in its Ayodhya title suit judgment divided the land in a 2:1 ratio, with two-thirds of the 2.77-acre, including the garbha griha, going to litigants for a Ram temple – Shri Ram Lala Virajman and Nirmohi Akhara. One-third of the land was given to the Sunni Central Waqf Board.

The verdict was challenged in the Supreme Court by both the Hindu and Muslim litigants. The apex court stayed the Allahabad High Court verdict. On November 9, 2019, a five-judge bench of the Supreme Court unanimously awarded the entire disputed land to the Hindu petitioners for a Ram temple at Ayodhya. It also decided to give land elsewhere for the construction of a mosque. The opening of the Ram Temple in Ayodhya is not merely a religious milestone, it is a turning point in the history of the country.
